# Pat Cranston: Pioneering professor reflects on her 40-year career at the UW



When Pat Cranston first came to the University of Washington in 1954, she was a pioneer in more ways than one. The future recipient of the Women in Communication's Lifetime Achievement Award, Cranston was at the time a young professor hired to work in the then-School of Journalism's radio-television track. Armed with a master's degree in journalism from the University of Texas at Austin, Cranston went on to become the School's first tenuretrack woman professor, and one of the first to teach broadcast journalism at the UW.
